## Chairman's Chat – By Bill Shively

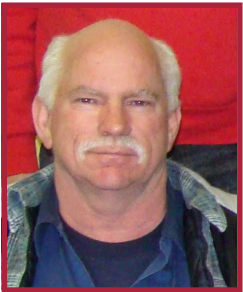
Hello Everyone! I can't believe it's back to school time already and the Delaware County Fair is just weeks away. This summer went fast!

The scheduled road work for Kingston Township should be completed. The trustees are going to identify low lying tree limbs and trees that are too close to the road that may be a hazard to drivers. The tree limbs will be cut back and all debris will be removed from the right-of-way. The Ohio Revised Code mandates that the township trustees must keep the road right-of-way free and clear of all tree limbs and overgrowth of vegetation or any other obstruction which may be a road hazard.

The deeds for the land donation to the township have been filed and are completed. The trustees are going to look over the land and get some insight as to what the possibilities are for the new township hall and park. We will advertise for a design architecture firm and get this project moving. The trustees will get an estimate for what the new hall and infrastructure will cost. We will explore the many funding tools available to the township.

The fall harvest season is just a few weeks away. Please use caution and be alert for large harvesting combines on the roadway. The combines are very large and cannot pullover just anywhere, so please be careful!

revisions. He has served on the board for more than a decade.

## BZA Vacancy

The Kingston Township Board of Trustees will be appointing one position on the Kingston Township Board of Zoning Appeals. The appointment fills an existing position with a term that expires December 2013. Interested Kingston Township residents should submit a letter of interest along with a resume to the Kingston Township Zoning Office prior to Friday, September 30, 2011.

The Board of Zoning Appeals meets on an as needed basis hearing variance requests, appeals of orders issued by the zoning inspector, conditional use requests, and revocations of authorized variances and conditional zoning certificates.

Applicants will be interviewed by the Board of Trustees during their monthly meeting on Tuesday, October 4, 2011, 7 p.m. at the Kingston Township Hall. The applicant must be present to be considered for the position.

## Zoning News

One zoning permit was issued for a room addition on Carter's Corner Rd. A lot split was completed for a five-acre parcel being split from 54.9 acres on N. Galena Rd.

An application was received for a side setback variance for an accessory building on 3 Bs & K Rd. A Board of Zoning Appeals hearing will be held August 23.

At the August Trustees meeting, Zoning Secretary Dave Stites discussed a variety of complaints received and handled. He explained the various stages of a number of complaints and trustees made decisions about moving forward on several. The complaints included tall grass, trash, a junk vehicle, and noise.

The trustees are developing a list of landscape contractors to use for hourly contract mowing for nuisance properties. The costs would be billed back to property owners of affected properties.

## Roads & Cemeteries

Road Superintendent Doug Crowl continues to investigate placement and material options for a 30' x 60' salt storage facility at the maintenance building.

Crowl is planning to realign the Blue Church Cemetery driveway off of State Route 521.

He also said that the 4" rain storm most of us experienced at the end of July overwhelmed many local roads and ditches. Blue Church and Berkshire roads resurfacing is complete.
